#### **President's Corner** Jerry Hartl

We hope everyone had a good winter even with the record setting snow around our area. We found our property to look like a cyclone had hit it with all the down limbs and trees. Our white pine trees dropped a huge amount of pine cones and many large limbs. We have taken many trailer loads of yard debris from our property. The large amount of snow has melted and the lake levels are back to full again. The dock and lifts are showing up and so soon will the boats & pontoons. As we begin our boating season, please remember to wear a life jacket and be safe while on the water.

#### **Boat Ramp - Crosby:**

Good news! The concrete pad issue at the Crosby ramp will be addressed. When the City of Crosby informed me that they had no funds to make the needed repairs, I reached out to Dani McNeal, Assistant Area Supervisor Parks & Trails Division DN. She was instrumental in developing a plan between the City of Crosby and the DNR to fix and maintain the landing. Matthew Hill, City of Crosby Administrator, applied and received DNR approval to increase one of the cement landings by 15 feet.

Once the plan is approved by the MN DNR, the DNR will repair the blow hole by installing the additional cement planks and connectors at the end of one of the existing ramps. Through the cooperative agreement between DNR and City of Crosby, the DNR would purchase, deliver, and install planks and connectors with no expectation of reimbursement from the City of Crosby. This will increase the length of the ramp and hopefully get the boats out into deeper water to be launched. In addition, the agreement will have a 4 year term to maintain the landing.

The project is planned to be addressed in July or August. In the interim, the current higher water levels should help drop in boats for the beginning of the season. The repairs will be made so when we have lower water in the fall, the larger boats can be removed without difficulty.

It is a win for all of us: lake owners, lake users, the City of Crosby, and the MN DNR.

### May 10, 2023 Spring Curlyleaf Pondweed (CLP) Treatments:

With the heavy snow cover combined with late ice out, the curlyleaf pondweed will be slower growing due to lack of getting sunlight and having a shorter growing period. Our selected partner, Freshwater Scientific Services, will be out by the end of May checking and mapping the beds for treatments. This information will then be sent to PLM Lake and Land Management Corporation who comes out and treats the curlyleaf pondweeds beds identified. Spring of 2022, SLA secured two \$1,500 DNR grant for the 2022 & 2023 season. When the mapping is finished, we will receive the cost for treatments. The 2022 treatment cost our association \$20,000 last spring due to the increase treatment costs and larger areas to be treated. We hope the treatments from last season and the shorter growing season will reduce the areas needing to be treated and therefore reduce cost to our association. The treatment company, PLM, has been very effective in removing the weeds and not killing our good lake weeds. The DNR grants help offset a small portion of the costs for inspections and treatments, but the majority is covered by our memberships and donations. Thank you for your continued support!

#### **Boat Inspector / Inspections:**

We contracted again with Crow Wing County for additional inspector hours at the <u>Deerwood</u> <u>Boat Landing</u> last season. We could not find anyone to work. The position is funded in partnership with Crow Wing County and SLA will be responsible for some additional charges. #### **City Docks in Crosby:**

We are working towards making this dream a reality. The Cuyuna Lakes Chamber will be working to raise funds from our areas businesses. We have pricing from Oars and Mines to use Flow docks. We need to ensure the docking system is safe and stable for all ages to use when docking. We are planning to schedule a meeting with the City of Crosby to get final approval and location of docks. We will be voting at the June 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Meeting regarding to support a matching fund of \$10,000 from our Lake Association. Basically we will matching dollar for dollar up to \$10,000. This will get the ball rolling in the funding process. We will be looking for any property owners who are willing to help with the funding to please donate. I don't know if we can make the timing for this boating season but plans are in the works. We will have other funding options that will be looking into for additional funding help.

Many Minnesota lakes have city docks for property owners to dock and gain access to the towns for food, drinks, shopping, and entertainment.

## Help keep our Serpent Lake clean and clear:

Some easy ways to keep up our properties looking nice and saving our lake.

- When cutting lawns please do not mow lawn clippings directly into the lake.
- Keep fires away for the lake shore, the ash is bad for our waters.
- Rake leaves in the fall away from the lake.

Plant flowers, leave 20 feet of no mowing area at the lake shore. By not cutting the grass within a few years you will make a nice buffer to take up phosphorus keeping it out of the lake.

**Remember:** Just one pound of phosphorus is enough to fuel the growth of 500 pounds of weeds and algae.

contribution and support! **If there is a red check slash** on your address label, it indicates we have not yet received your membership dues for the 2022-2023 year (<u>our</u> <u>fiscal year runs June 1<sup>st</sup> to</u> <u>May 31<sup>st</sup></u>). Thank you!

Why are the membership dues so important? We need your help and financial resources to manage the needs of our lake. We work to be as efficient as possible with the use of the association budget. All board members, water testers, road clean-up crews and buoy maintainers are all unpaid volunteers. Our main planning item in our annual budget for the Serpent Lake Association is the \$15,000-\$30,000 per year to treat the one invasive species, CLP. The consequence of not treating this weed every year would be unnavigable waters caused by weed-mats and loss of property values around the lake. We are also now checking for a new invasive that is in 21 of our Minnesota Lakes and in Thunder Lake, just up the road in Cass County. It is called Starry Stonewort and it too can develop into a thick mat and cause unnavigable waters. We will be steadfast in our testing for this new invasive weed.

We very much appreciate those members contributing over and above their dues to the Serpent Lake Preservation Fund because it is this fund with which we cover the weed control cost and water testing lab fees. I highly encourage those property owners who are not members to join, pay the dues, and a make contribution to the preservation fund to keep our lake healthy and clean.
